


The eCR Now initiative and the Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) call on healthcare organizations to implement electronic case reporting (eCR) for COVID-19 and other diseases. Public health agencies need more timely and complete data. Hospitals, healthcare systems, ambulatory practices, and their partners can increase the implementation of eCR through participation in the eCR Now COVID-19 Challenge.

The Challenge will increase the number of electronic health records (EHRs) enabled with eCR capabilities by use of the eCR Now FHIR® App and the HL7 FHIR® standard. The App enables eCR, helps meet legal reporting requirements, fulfills CMS' Promoting Interoperability Program requirements, and moves public health in our nation forward.

The eCR Now COVID-19 Challenge will make up to three awards of \$100,000 and three awards of \$60,000 to eligible participants that accomplish production electronic case reporting for COVID-19 using the eCR Now FHIR® App.

Successful participants must implement the eCR Now FHIR® App in production healthcare operations by April 16, 2021.

 - 4 Notify:** Submit the required application material by **April 16, 2021**.



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Electronic Case Reporting for COVID-19 Now

- eCR is a critical tool for COVID-19 and other reporting needs to **state and local public health agencies**
- **Critical clinical data for outbreak management** include:
 - Patient identity and demographics, co-morbidities, race and ethnicity, occupation, pregnancy status, other clinical data
- There are **many reporting asks**
 - Electronic laboratory reporting (ELR) provides lab results
 - Syndromic surveillance provides anonymized patient data
 - Hospital capacity data are also reported
- **eCR provides the identifiable clinical patient data to state and local public health agencies they need for outbreak management and action**

Electronic Case Reporting for COVID-19 Now

- When COVID-19 began there were **few EHRs with eCR** capabilities. **Public health agencies were just beginning to implement eCR.** There were **3 eCR trial implementations.**
- One would think an emergency would be the worst time to move a program forward, but it is a public health paradox:
 - Now is when **attention** is focused on public health
 - Now is when the **resources** are available
 - Now is when providers of care need to be **released from manual reporting** obligations
 - And now is not the time for individual jurisdictions to make unique, **non standards-based data asks** of healthcare organizations
- We need to be sensitive to PHA and Healthcare pressures but do need **more implementations of eCR Now!**

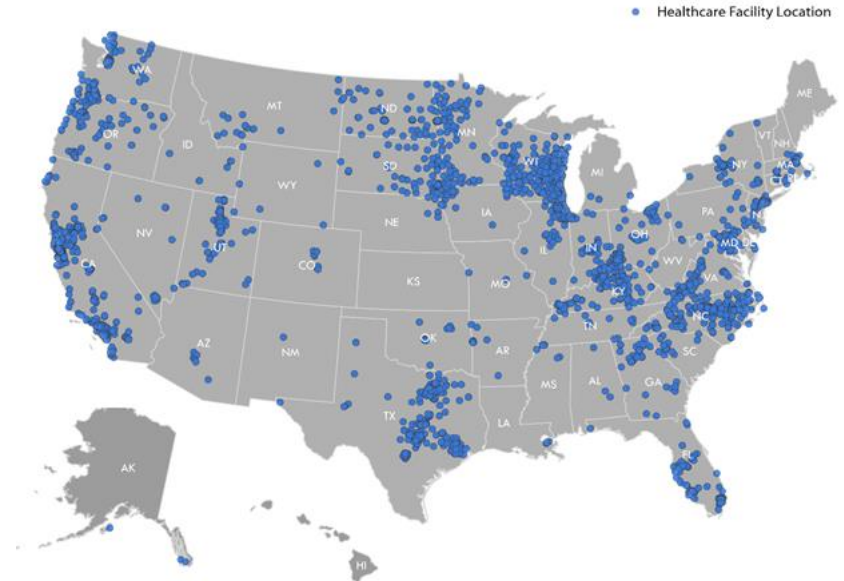
eCR Now Elements

1. Rapid cohort-based COVID-19 eCR implementations for provider sites that have eCR enabled EHRs
2. **An eCR Now FHIR App that other EHRs can use to do electronic case reporting**
3. A nationwide eCR trust framework for eHealth Exchange, Carequality, CommonWell members, and those who connect to them

eCR Now- Element

Cohort-based COVID-19 rapid eCR implementations for provider sites that have eCR enabled EHRs

- A **standard ask for patient data** from all jurisdictions implemented in as little as **3-5 days**
- As of **November 6, 6,000+ facilities** are doing **COVID-19 eCR**
- **3 M+ COVID-19 reports** have been sent to **61 public health agencies**



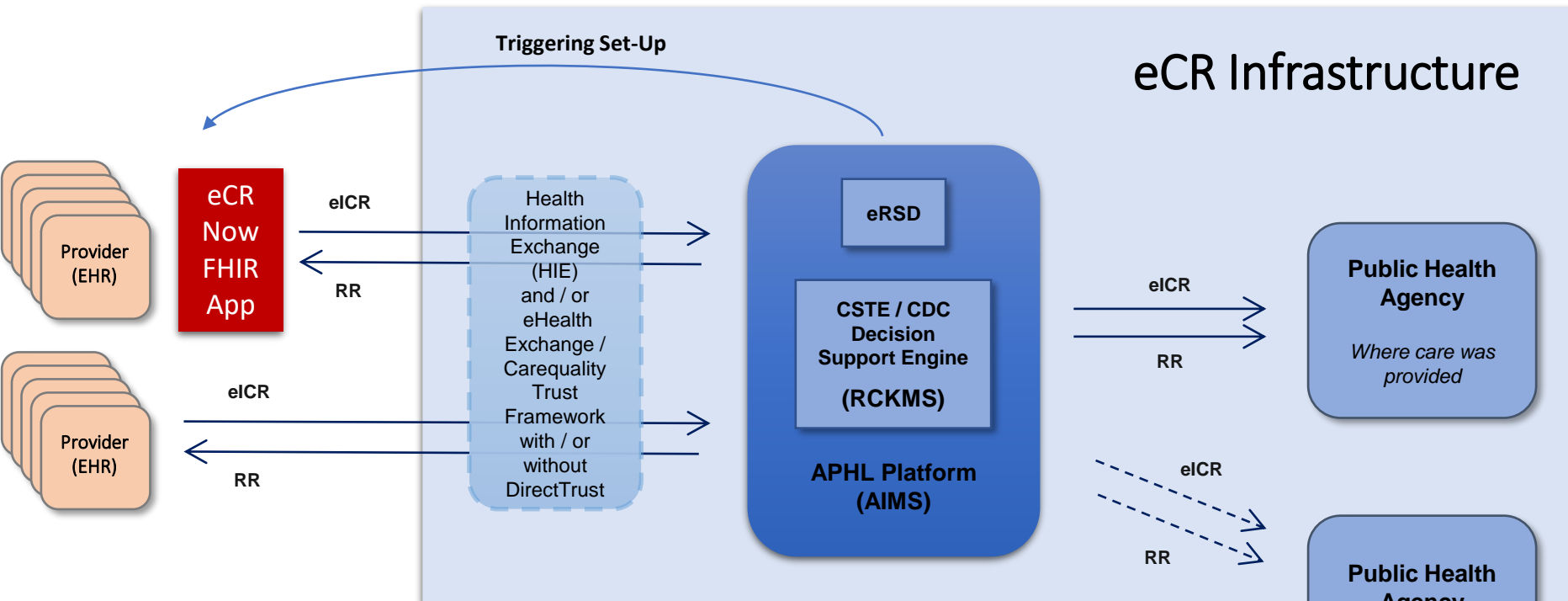

eCR Now – Element 2

An **eCR Now FHIR App** that other EHRs can use to implement electronic case reporting

- For EHRs that do not otherwise have native eCR capabilities
- Handles triggering and trigger codes, eCR creation, RR sorting, etc.
- Works with EHRs that support the FHIR DSTU2 or R4 APIs
- Several possible implementation models
 - Locally implemented or cloud hosted
 - SMART on FHIR or system app launch

eCR Now COVID-19 Challenge Goals

- Increase the number of EHRs that can do COVID-19 electronic case reporting (eCR) now
- Automate reporting for providers of care and make it faster, more complete, and bidirectional
- For each EHR implemented be able to replicate into more implementations
- Implement infrastructure to do 89+ eCR conditions when advancing out of COVID-19



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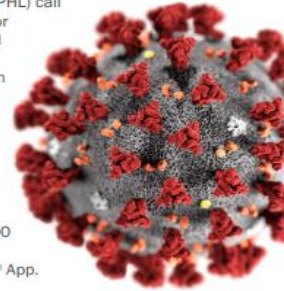
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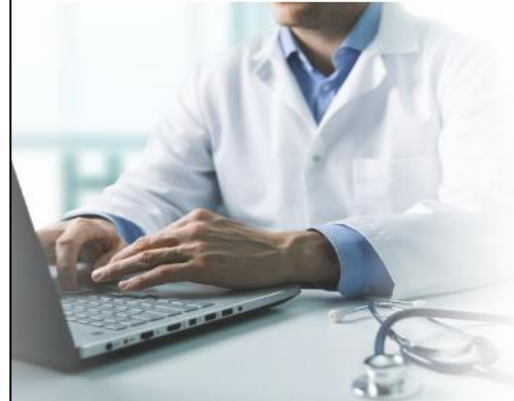

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Many Models and Team Permutations

- Awards can be made to a variety of organization types and teams
- Healthcare organization(s) and EHR vendor(s) will likely need to be engaged somehow
- Award recipient / team member could be:
 - Healthcare organization
 - EHR vendor
 - Health Information Exchange
 - Third party reporting organization
 - Health Center Controlled Network
 - Others...

Challenge Requirements

- Implement production electronic case reporting (eCR) using the eCR Now FHIR® App in one or more healthcare facility(ies)
- Fulfill the [eCR Implementation Requirements Checklist](#).
 - Utilize the App's HL7 electronic initial case reporting (eICR) version 1.1 and Reportability Response 1.0 documents
 - Use the App to submit eICRs to the APHL Informatics Messaging Services (AIMS) platform for confirmation of reportability and delivery to appropriate public health agencies
 - Receive Reportability Responses and deliver the relevant ones to the patient's chart and/or the provider of care
- Demonstrate successful implementation(s) to the Challenge panel

Challenge Categories and Awards

- Hospitals/health systems in the United States and its Territories
 - Up to three awards of \$100,000 each
 - APHL anticipates that one of the three awards will go to a hospital or hospitals serving a predominately rural and/or underserved population
- Ambulatory practice(s) in the United States and its Territories
 - Up to three awards of \$60,000 each
 - APHL anticipates that one of the three awards will go to an ambulatory provider, or group of ambulatory providers, serving a predominately rural and/or underserved population

Challenge Judging Criteria

- **Breadth of Impact:** The breadth of impact will be evaluated by evidence of:
 - the number of patients and providers that are covered by the new eCR reporting
 - the implementation of eCR in one or more EHR product(s) that have not previously implemented eCR capabilities
 - support for validation of reporting data and meet provider goals for consideration of turning off manual reporting
- **Minimizing Provider Burden:** Minimizing provider burden will be evaluated by evidence of:
 - launching the eCR Now FHIR® App without provider workflow interruption (ideally consistently and invisibly to the provider)
 - minimizing any requirements for manual reporting by launching the app for the full breadth of patient encounters

Challenge Judging Criteria

- **Maximizing Provider Value:** Maximizing provider value will be evaluated by evidence of:
 - delivery of appropriate Reportability Responses (those that identify one or more “reportable” or “may be reportable” condition)
 - delivery to the patient’s record and/or the provider of record and/or appropriate infection control and/or when appropriate administrative reporting staff
- **Policy and Technical Compliance:** Policy and technical compliance will be evaluated by evidence of:
 - completing the [eCR requirements checklist](#)

Challenge Award Funding, Administration and Rules

- The Challenge awards are made possible by funding from the [CDC Foundation](#) and will be administered by APHL
- All awards are made at the discretion of the Challenge panel and are final
- Only complete application submissions will be considered for an award
- APHL and CDC Foundation employees and their contactors are not eligible for challenge awards
